

2016 Hands-on History and Art Camp, June 6-10

Week-long camp with a theme of “Cool Constructions.” Long-time teachers and artists, Faith Revell and Jan Whalen, will integrate history with hands-on lessons and an array of art projects to create multi-faceted camp experiences. Activities will take place in the museum’s tent on the grounds, inside the museum itself and out-of-doors in the surrounding community.

“Found and Assembled,” a summer exhibit on display at the museum that showcases the work of Alaskan artists who find, combine, construct and assemble disparate objects to create an imaginative whole will form the jumping off point for campers to gather, make and produce unique art works. Check out artist Joseph Cornell’s art boxes and Alexander Calder’s miniature circus. We will explore their work, too, and create our own.

Camp is divided into two sessions, a morning session for students who have completed grades K-3 and an afternoon session for students who have completed grades 4-7. Older students may opt to attend both the morning and afternoon sessions.

Morning Session: Little Culture Kids (LCK)

9:00 am – 12:00 pm, M-F

\$50 per week per child

Participating students have graduated from K and will enter 1st through 4th grade in the fall. A maximum of 12 students will comprise the program.

Afternoon Session: Big History Buffs (BHB)

1:00 – 4:00 pm, M-F

\$60 per week per child

Participating students have graduated from 4th grade and will enter 5th through 8th grades in the fall. A maximum of 12 students will comprise the program.

- **STUDENTS SHOULD DRESS FOR MESS EVERY DAY.** We will be creating art that sometimes gets messy.
- **STUDENTS SHOULD BRING APPROPRIATE OUTDOOR WEAR EVERY DAY.** (raincoat, boots, warm layers) We will be indoors and outside as is appropriate with each project.
